To play, first each player sets up their 12 pieces in the 3 rows at the bottom of their side. Each row should have 4 pieces, and each piece should be placed on a dark square. Then, players take alternating turns moving pieces forward diagonally on the dark squares. Pieces cannot be moved on to the white squares, and a piece may not move backwards.

To begin the game, each player places his or her pieces. One piece goes on each dark-colored square of the three rows nearest to the player's side of the board. Pieces come in sets of contrasting colors, typically black and red, white and black, or black and red. The darker of the two colors moves first.

Checkers is played by two players. Each player begins the game with 12 colored discs. (Typically, one set of pieces is black and the other red.) Each player places his or her pieces on the 12 dark squares closest to him or her.
