How to Apply - Application Guide | grants.nih.gov

A reviewer must often read 10-15 applications in great detail so your application has a better chance of being successful if it is easy-to-read and well-written. Write a clear topic sentence for each paragraph with one main point or idea. This is key for readability. Make your points as direct as possible.

11-point font size or larger. No more than 15 characters per linear inch (including spaces) No more than 6 lines per vertical inch. We recommend but do not require the following font types: Arial, Georgia, Helvetica, and Palatino Linotype. Legibility is key.

The R01 is the NIH standard independent research project grant. An R01 is meant to give you four or five years of support to complete a project, publish, and reapply before the grant ends. Read more at NIAID’s Comparing Popular Research Project Grants: R01, R03, or R21 .

Start with your Significance and Innovation sections. Then draft the Approach section considering the personnel and skills you'll need for each step. Evaluate your Specific Aims and methods in light of your expected budget (for a new PI, it should be modest, probably under the \$250,000 for NIH's modular budget).

National Institutes of Health ... We will add headers, footers, page numbers, bookmarks and a table of contents when we assemble your grant application upon submission. Headings (e.g., Significance, Innovation) within the text of your attachments improve readability and are highly encouraged.

Grant Deadlines Grant Deadlines Overview. NLM grant deadlines are the same as those of other NIH Institutes and Centers, unless otherwise noted. Each program has 3 application deadlines per year. RFA Deadlines. In addition to investigator-initiated grant programs, NLM also participates in Request for Applications (RFA) announcements.

QUICK GUIDE FOR GRANT APPLICATIONS

After you have decided the area of research to pursue, start thinking about your planned experiments by first drafting objectives, known in NIH lingo as Specific Aims. Be sure you can complete your Aims within the typical timeframe for your chosen Funding Opportunity Announcement (FOA). For an R01, that’s typically four to five years.

Review Guidelines for Grant Applications It is important to keep in mind the five criteria that reviewers are asked to apply when assessing the majority of grant applications. As defined in Step 2 these are: significance, approach, innovation, investigator and environment. Other criteria may be considered for other grant mechanisms.

When NIH funds your proposal, NIH will require an annual Progress Report to document your accomplishments and compliance with the terms of award. NIH requires that Progress Reports be submitted by an Authorized Organization Representative therefore, the Progress Report has to be submitted through OPAS by the “Signing Official.”

NIH still recommends that you choose black or other high-contrast text colors since they print well and are legible to the largest audience. The second change shortens the list of NIH-recommended font faces to these four: Arial, Georgia, Helvetica, and Palatino Linotype.

The Specific Aims section is the most vital part of any NIH grant application. In this section, you must quickly gain the reviewers’ trust and confidence while simultaneously convincing them that your work is important to fund. You must also convey that you and your team are the best people to complete the work you’ve proposed.
